Detainee Death Report: GASPAR Andres, Francisco

Immigration History

On an unknown date and place, Mr. GASPAR Andres entered United States without inspection, admission, or parole by an immigration officer.

On October 24, 2018, the U.S. Border Patrol (USBP) encountered Mr. GASPAR Andres in Fort Lauderdale, FL, during a routine bus check operation. USBP processed Mr. GASPAR Andres and served him with a Notice to Appear as an alien present in the United States without admission or parole. Subsequently, USBP transferred custody of Mr. GASPAR-Andres to Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) Miami, who detained him at the Broward Transitional Center in Pompano Beach, FL.

On November 21, 2018, ERO Miami released Mr. GASPAR Andres from custody on bond.

On September 1, 2025, ICE ERO arrested Mr. GASPAR Andres as part of a pre-planned enforcement operation and detained him at Krome South Processing Center (KSPC) in Miami, FL.

On September 19, 2025, ICE ERO transferred Mr. GASPAR Andres to El Paso Camp East Montana (CEM), in El Paso, Texas (TX) pending removal proceedings.

Synopsis of Events

On September 2, 2025, a KSPC registered nurse (RN) completed Mr. GASPAR Andres' intake screening using a Spanish interpreter, documented normal vital signs and his denial of any past medical history or alcohol consumption, and cleared him for general population.

On September 3, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres presented to the clinic with complaints of anxiety. An RN completed an urgent care visit, noted he was visibly shaking, documented normal vital signs and released Mr. GASPAR Andres to his housing unit.

On September 4, 2025, custody staff escorted Mr. GASPAR Andres to the medical clinic due to anxiety and confusion. An RN completed an urgent care assessment and documented that Mr. GASPAR Andres appeared anxious, fidgety, and confused, exhibited bilateral hand tremors, had elevated blood pressure and pulse readings and a history of alcohol use. The RN also noted a high score on the Clinical Institute Withdrawal Assessment (CIWA) and notified an advanced practice provider (APP), who referred Mr. GASPAR Andres by ambulance to West Baptist Hospital for evaluation and treatment of alcohol withdrawal.



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Between September 4 and 7, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres remained hospitalized. West Baptist medical staff diagnosed him with cirrhosis of the liver and treated him for alcohol withdrawal complications, including hepatic encephalopathy, alcoholism, anemia, aspiration pneumonia, delirium tremens, hyponatremia, mitral regurgitation, and thrombocytopenia. West Baptist medical staff discharged Mr. GASPAR Andres from the hospital, and he returned to KSPC.

On September 7, 2025, a KSPC RN documented Mr. GASPAR Andres' return from the hospital, a CIWA score of 0, and normal vital signs, referred him to an APP, and cleared him for general population.

On September 8, 2025, an APP completed Mr. GASPAR Andres' comprehensive health assessment, documented normal vital signs, prescribed medications and vitamins, ordered routine laboratory tests and a 23-hour observation, and referred him to a behavioral health provider.

On September 9, 2025, a psychiatric APP completed Mr. GASPAR Andres' behavioral health evaluation, noted no history of mental health disturbance, a history of alcohol abuse, diagnosed him with alcohol dependence, and advised him to follow up as needed.

On September 19, 2025, ICE transferred Mr. GASPAR Andres to CEM, in El Paso, TX where CEM medical staff completed Mr. GASPAR-Andres' intake screening, documented normal vital signs, no significant medical history or medications, and cleared him for general population.

On September 20, 2025, an APP completed Mr. GASPAR Andres' comprehensive health assessment, documented normal vital signs, good health, and an overall unremarkable exam, advised him to request sick call as needed, and cleared him for general population.

On September 23, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres complained of acid reflux and headaches. An RN evaluated him, documented normal vital signs, obtained an APP order to provide Mr. GASPAR Andres with medication for acid reflux and headache, and advised him to return to sick call as needed.

On September 25, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres complained of acid reflux and seasonal allergies. Medical staff member evaluated him, documented normal vital signs, administered a one-time dose of medication to treat allergies and advised him to return to sick call as needed.

On October 9, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres complained of heartburn, bloating, and upset stomach. An APP evaluated him, documented normal vital signs, diagnosed him with indigestion and heartburn, provided a dose of medication and advised him to return to sick call as needed.

On October 20, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres complained of heartburn and bright red blood in his stools. An APP documented normal vital signs, a prior medical history of anemia and alcohol use, current jaundiced eyes with no other signs or symptoms of alcohol withdrawal, and diagnosed him with iron deficiency anemia, constipation, and gastro-esophageal reflux disease (GERD) without esophagitis. The APP administered medications, ordered labs to assess his iron and metabolic health, and advised him to return to the clinic if symptoms worsen or bright red rectal bleeding persists.

On November 8, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres was evaluated for complaints of cold-like symptoms. Mr. GASPAR Andres tested negative for COVID and Flu A/B and his vital signs were documented as normal. He was diagnosed with an acute upper respiratory infection and given medication to treat his condition. Mr. GASPAR Andres was advised to return to sick call as needed.



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On November 13, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres complained of sore throat, cough, and body aches. An APP evaluated him, documented normal vital signs, diagnosed him with an acute cough with throat inflammation, administered medication, and advised him to return to sick call as needed.

- **On the same date**, Mr. GASPAR Andres complained of bleeding gums. An APP evaluated him, documented a normal blood pressure reading, an elevated heart rate, negative flu and COVID tests, and positive bleeding gums. The APP diagnosed him with adjustment insomnia, unspecified pain, specified dental gum disorders, administered ordered medication, and advised him to return to sick call as needed.

On November 14, 2025, an APP evaluated Mr. GASPAR Andres for cold-like symptoms and documented elevated body temperature, low blood pressure, elevated heart rate, body aches, cough, negative flu and COVID tests, and gastric reflux. The APP diagnosed him with influenza, ordered medication, and advised him to return to sick call if symptoms worsen.

On November 15, 2025, a physician evaluated Mr. GASPAR Andres' for ankle pain, runny nose, cough, and fever, documented a low blood pressure reading, elevated heart rate, elevated body temperature reading, negative flu and COVID tests, fever, cough, with phlegm, and chest pain. The physician ordered an electrocardiogram (result: sinus tachycardia) and prescribed medication.

On November 16, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres complained of bilateral lower extremity swelling and leg pain. An APP evaluated him, documented leg swelling and taut skin, jaundice, a low blood pressure reading, elevated heart rate, diagnosed him with localized edema, and referred him to a local hospital for further evaluation and treatment.

Between November 16 and December 3, 2025, Mr. GASPAR Andres remained hospitalized at The Hospitals of Providence (THOP) East Campus, in El Paso, TX for hyponatremia, lethargy, pansinusitis, elevated lactic acid and ammonia levels, hepatic dysfunction, blood pooling in his liver, renal failure, and sepsis. A THOP physician noted Mr. GASPAR-Andres' continual decline, resulting in his intubation (tube inserted through the airway to allow air into the lungs), and transferred him to the intensive care unit.

On December 3, 2025, at 5:53 a.m., a THOP physician pronounced Mr. GASPAR-Andres deceased.

- **On the same date**, Mr. GASPAR-Andres' autopsy report noted his cause of death as complications of alcoholic hepatic cirrhosis and cardiac hypertrophy (increased size of the heart).
