



**U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)
Detainee Death Report: ABDULKADIR, Fouad Saeed**

Immigration History

Mr. ABDULKADIR, a 46-year-old male citizen of Eritrea, was admitted to the United States at Los Angeles, CA, as a nonimmigrant on March 2, 2012, using a false Sudanese passport. He adjusted his status to lawful permanent resident in 2019. On April 3, 2024, the United States District Court, Northern District of Ohio, convicted him of wire fraud and theft of public money, with losses exceeding \$10,000, and sentenced him to 21 months incarceration. On May 13, 2025, ERO Philadelphia arrested Mr. ABDULKADIR at the Federal Bureau of Prisons, Allenwood, PA, and booked him at the Moshannon Valley Processing Center (MVPC) in Philipsburg, PA. He was served with a Notice to Appear, alleging removability under Section 237(a)(2)(A)(iii) of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

Synopsis of Events

Upon arrival at MVPC, Mr. ABDULKADIR underwent an intake screening and comprehensive medical assessment. He reported a history of asthma, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, auditory and visual hallucinations, head injuries, inability to walk, and ongoing physical therapy and mental health counseling. He used a wheelchair and was on multiple medications. Over the following months, he received regular medical and behavioral health evaluations for chronic pain, asthma, and complex mental health needs including PTSD, depression, anxiety, and hallucinations. He intermittently refused labs, imaging, and some medications, but remained engaged with medical and behavioral health staff.

In early December 2025, Mr. ABDULKADIR reported chest pain, numbness, and tingling. Evaluation revealed abnormal EKG findings and elevated blood pressure. He declined recommended admission to the medical housing unit for monitoring. In the days that followed, he refused several medications and blood pressure checks, and continued to report symptoms.

On December 14, 2025, Mr. ABDULKADIR reported trouble breathing in the early morning hours. Medical staff responded, transported him to the clinic, and noted rapid deterioration to agonal breathing and respiratory distress. Emergency medical services were activated, and medical staff initiated rescue breathing, chest compressions, and advanced cardiac life support. Emergency medical services (EMS) arrived, intubated Mr. ABDULKADIR, and administered multiple rounds of resuscitative medications. Despite extensive efforts, he was pronounced deceased at approximately 3:21 a.m. on December 14, 2025.
